

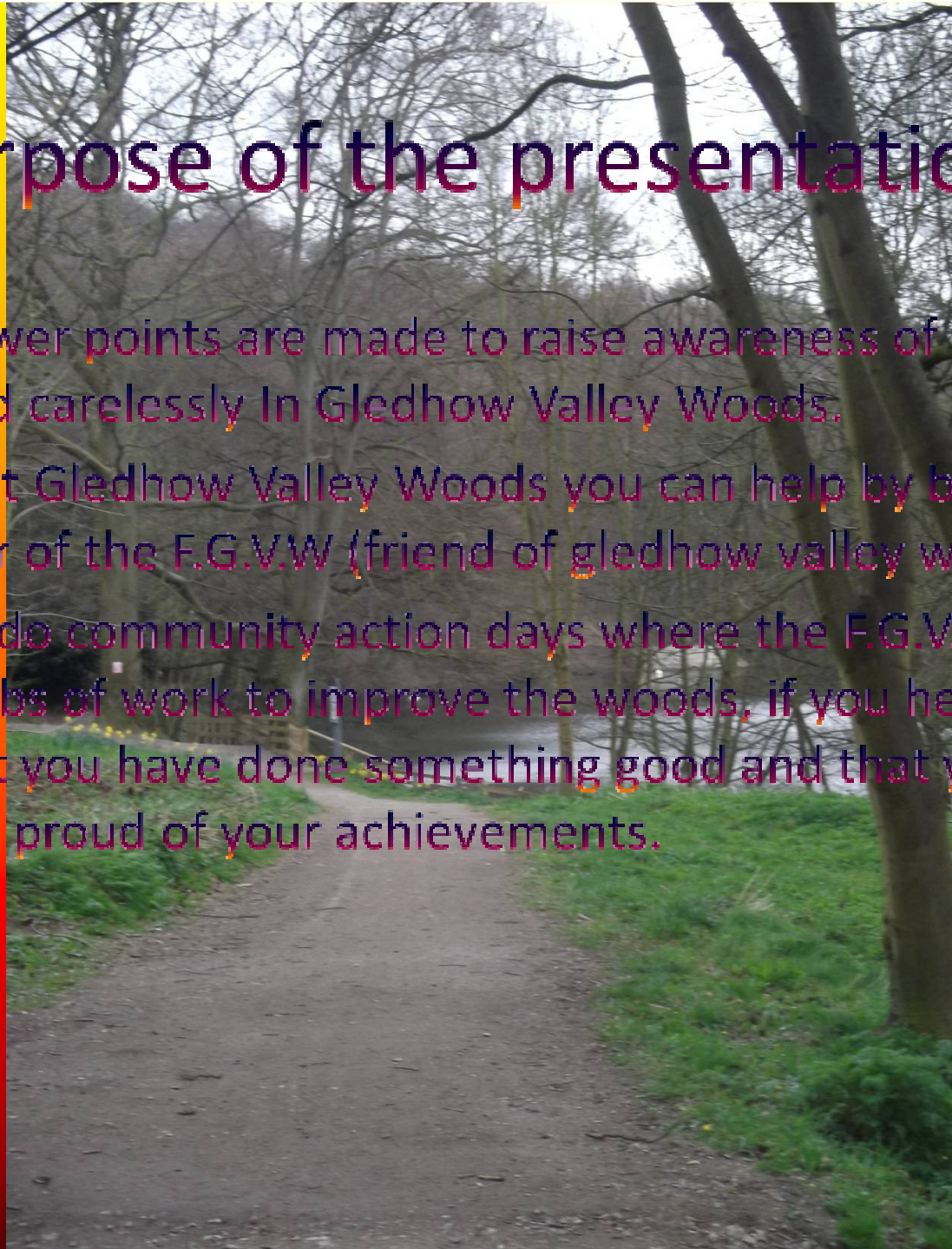

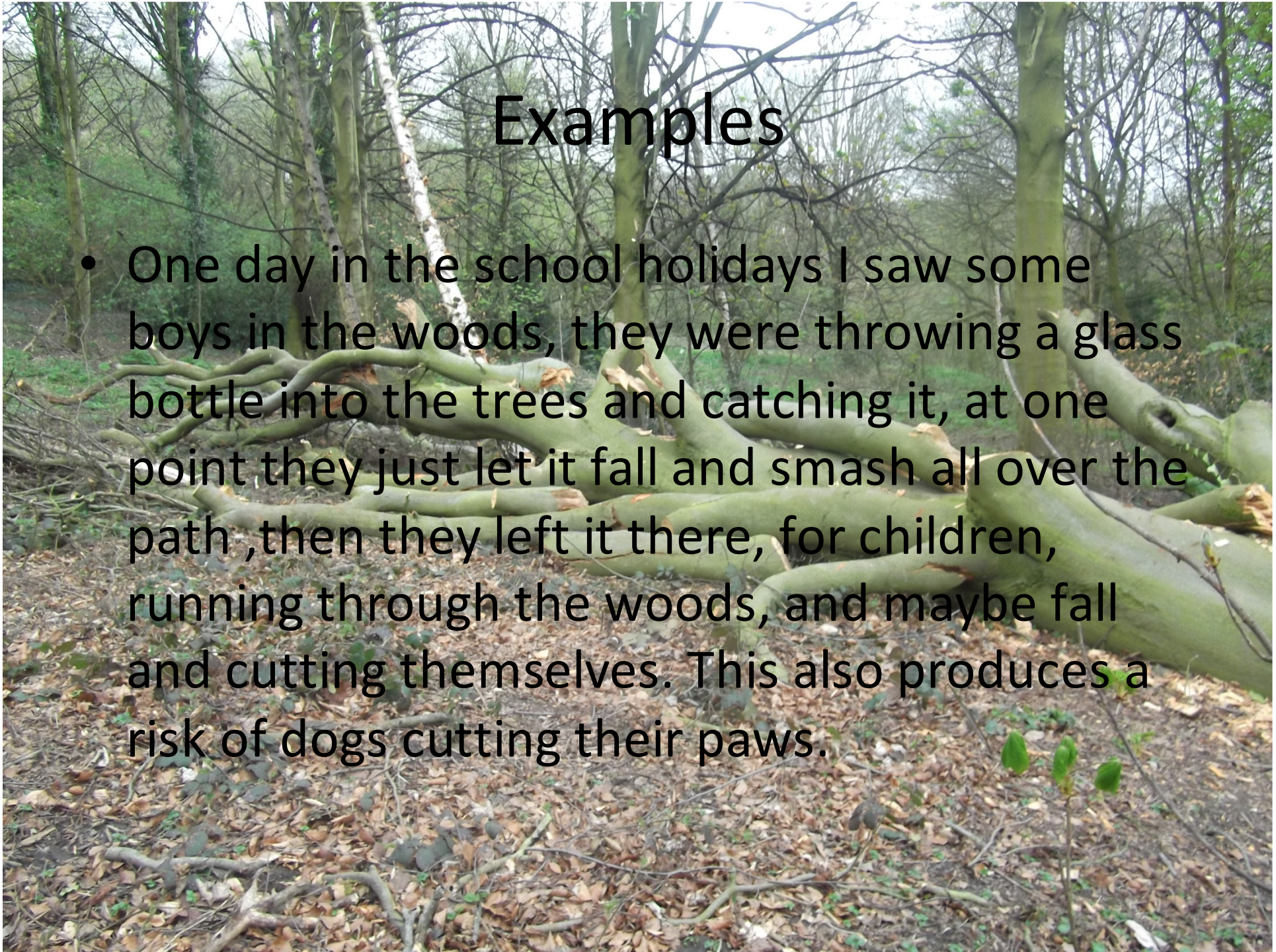
Purpose of the presentation
